In the second hour, parents/caregivers and youth come together for family activities and projects.

- Must be a certified Strengthening Families Program (SFP) facilitator training will be provided to committed facilitators
- Successfully pass a Washington State Patrol Background Screening (or similar agency)
- Fluent in Spanish
