For those interested in the fields of behavioral health, education, social services, or bereavement, a role as a **VISTA Grief Support Development Coordinator** with United General District 304 will provide valuable training, hands-on experience, and community connections. Help to re-establish a volunteer-led peer grief support program in our community and bring children, teens, and parents who are grieving together on the path towards healing. People of color, people with disabilities, veterans, and other candidates with diverse experiences interested in this opportunity are encouraged to apply.

- 12-month (365 day) service commitment beginning in summer or fall 2023
 - o Full-time position (40 hours per week)
 - o Includes 5 holidays and 2.5 personal days
- \$22,802 living allowance annually (\$877.62 paid biweekly)
- \$6,495 Education Award upon completion of service commitment or option for cash stipend
- Relocation allowance, if moving more than 50 miles for VISTA service
- Childcare assistance, if eligible

- One year of non-competitive eligibility for federal employment upon completion of service commitment

- Experience with program planning and development

- Comfortable working with youth of all ages

- Eager to collaborate with partners and volunteers and work in a team
- Confident with public speaking and sharing information with diverse audiences
- Practice with creating/maintaining a welcoming and inclusive environment

Position Responsibilities include:

- Applying grief-informed practices in all aspects of service (training provided)
- Developing volunteer recruitment and management systems aligned with organizational policies and best practices
- Working with stakeholders to determine key program logistics and evaluation
- Establishing and fostering relationships with local agencies and schools as partners and resources
- Marketing programs through press releases, social media, and informational sessions
- Identifying and pursuing diversified funding streams to support bereavement services
- Participating in AmeriCorps service projects and local service opportunities
- Assisting host site with ongoing community initiatives and regional events
