In collaboration with the Children's Council of Skagit County, this position will help design and establish a parent education series as part of an overall effort to build a continuum of early childhood development supports. People of color, people with disabilities, veterans, and other candidates with diverse experiences interested in this opportunity are encouraged to apply.

- \$22,802 living allowance annually (\$877.62 paid biweekly)
- \$6,495 Education Award upon completion of service commitment or option for cash stipend
- Relocation allowance, if moving more than 50 miles for VISTA service
- Childcare assistance, if eligible

- One year of non-competitive eligibility for federal employment upon completion of service commitment

- Tracking participants through pre and post evaluations
- Establishing and fostering relationships with agencies as partners and resources
- Researching diversified funding streams to support parenting courses
